#### ABOUT THE WORKSHOP:

The challenge procedure is a mechanism whereby an arbitrator can be replaced, for instance, if he refuses to act, becomes incapacitated or there is good cause to set aside his or her appointment. The Court has jurisdiction to decide these issues, but the Association can do the same in respect of arbitrations falling within its domain.

The grounds for challenge will be discussed. It will include issues such as fitness to act. The all-embracing ground "good cause" will be looked at and considered in light of the authorities. The Association's procedure will also be dealt with. Arbitrators must be acutely aware of the fact that their appointment is not immune to challenge.
