Advocate Kiki Bailey SC is a senior member of the Johannesburg Society of Advocates, and of the Maisels 3 Group in Sandton. She was admitted as an Advocate of the High Court of South Africa in 1990, and became a member of the Johannesburg Bar during the same year. She was appointed Senior Counsel of the Republic of South Africa on 10 December, 2009.

Bailey obtained the BA and LLB degrees at the University of the Witwatersrand. Prior to her admission as an advocate, Bailey was admitted and practiced as an attorney of the High Court of South Africa.

During 2012, Bailey completed her advanced diploma in Alternative Dispute Resolution, *summa cum laude*, with the University of Pretoria and the Arbitration Foundation of Southern Africa (AFSA). She obtained such advanced certification in conflict management and dispute resolution, consensus building processes and skills, commercial arbitration, arbitration in construction, and divorce mediation.

Bailey has also held appointments as an Acting Judge of the Gauteng Local Division of the High Court of South Africa, and has also acted as mediator and arbitrator. She further serves as a director of the Association of Arbitrators (Southern Africa).

She has been elected as Fellow of the Association of Arbitrators (Southern Africa) and serves on the Commercial Panel of Arbitrators of the Arbitration Foundation of South Africa.

The main fields of interest of her practice are building and construction law, contract law and general commercial law. She has held numerous appointments as adjudicator and arbitrator mainly in disputes arising from the construction industry.
