Correspondence Courses

Overview

This sought after one-year Specialisation in Construction Law Course (“the Specialisation Course”) for members, now in its 23rd year of presentation, focusses on the advanced law of contract peculiar to the engineering profession and the construction industry. Special emphasis is placed on the common law principles applicable thereto. Applicable case law is addressed and members are furnished with course notes on the relevant principles.

Learning Format/Course Structure

The course consists of one module (Module 5). Members wanting to undertake the course may make application by completing the [application form](#). The link to this facility can be found on the Association’s web page, www.arbitrators.co.za.

The Association’s Specialisation Course is an online learning course which is presented exclusively through the e-Learning Portal. Students are expected to be able to independently work through the course material, undertake relevant research, submit assignments and prepare for the online examinations. Students are required to attend compulsory online workshops.

Students will therefore be required to have access to the Internet in order to be able to download the course material, submit the compulsory assignments, receive communications from the Association and write the online exam. Students, when applying for the course, must be familiar with the course requirements and information set out in the [Course Information Booklet](#) which is available on the Association’s [website](#).

Requirements for Applying

A prospective student must be a [Fellow](#) of the Association, or must have successfully completed [Modules 1](#) and [3](#) of the [Correspondence Courses](#), or must be exempted from [Modules 1](#) and [3](#) through holding a South African law degree.
